Hila Shamir is an Associate Professor at Tel-Aviv University Faculty of Law. She earned her S.J.D. and LL.M. from Harvard Law School and LL.B. from Tel-Aviv University. Shamir teaches and researches in the fields of Employment, Labor, Immigration, and Welfare Law with a focus on issues of labor trafficking, and feminist legal thought. Shamir has taught at Cornell Law School, UC Berkeley, and Harvard University. She served as Associate Dean of Academic Affairs at TAU Law (2017-2018). Shamir received an European Research Council (ERC) grant to pursue research on a Labor Approach to Human Trafficking (TraffLab, 2018-2023). She is also the recipient of a Fulbright Scholarship, the EU Marie Curie Reintegration Grant, and of research grants from the Israeli Science Foundation and the Israeli Ministry of Science and Technology. Her recent publications include: A Labor Paradigm for Human Trafficking, *60 UCLA Law Review* 76 (2012); and the book GOVERNANCE FEMINISM: AN INTRODUCTION, co-authored with Janet Halley, Prabha Kotiswaran and Rachel Rebouche (2018, Minnesota University Press).
